Her clothes caught fire when her mother was using a paraffin stove. Her face, side, arm and leg were very badly burned - 35% of her body, the doctors estimate. She is only three months old. In her notes the doctor recorded "Right hand not viable". What a start in life for that little girl.



In many ways you could say "not viable" of the young lives we meet. They are sick, many have impoverished and unstable homes and most have very little education. What sort of life lies ahead of them?



We are there to let them know about the one who brings life, real life, life that challenges and thrills. In short, a life that is viable, a life that is worth living.



It starts with love. And we show these lonely children that there are people who care and there is a God who cares. For some we are able to help with education, and this may help them to get qualifications and a job when they grow up.
